Three Pines Dishcloth

Three Pines Dishcloth is a fun and simple pattern with some texture and a bit of simple eyelet lace. The inspiration for this design is the fictional town of Three Pines in Quebec (from the Inspector Armand Gamache series written by Louise Penny). While I love to read about faraway places, I also really enjoy reading about rural Quebec and Montreal which are places near and dear to me.

<u>Size</u>	<u>Yarn</u>
Approx. 9.5 by 9.5 inches	Estelle Sudz, 100% cotton, 74 m or 50 g
<u>Needles</u>	<u>Notions</u>
3.25 mm or US 3 needles (straight or circular)	Tapestry needle

Cast on 42 stitches:

Border: Rows 1-4: K42

<u>Three Pines pattern:</u> Row 1: K3, *K3, YO, (S2, K1, PSSO), YO* repeat to last 3 stitches, K3 Rows 2-3: K42 Row 4: K3, P36, K3 Repeat Rows 1-4 11 more times (12 total)

<u>Border:</u> Row 1: K3, P36, K3 Rows 2-4: K42

Bind off and weave ends in. ABBREVIATIONS:

K – knit P – purl S2, K1, PSSO – Slip 2 stitches from right needle to left needle, Knit 1, Pass the 2 slipped stitches over the knit stitch
